



Position Summary:

Assemblers will assemble trailers daily under the supervision of the Production Manager. This position will develop processes that maximize efficiency, productivity, quality and safety.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Prepares work to be accomplished by studying assembly instructions, blueprints, specifications and parts lists and gathering parts, subassemblies, tools and materials.
- Positions parts and subassemblies by using templates or reading measurements.
- Assembles components by examining connections for correct fit, fastening parts and subassemblies while checking for defects
- Verifies specifications by measuring completed components
- Resolves assembly problems by altering dimensions to meet specifications, notifying supervisor to obtain additional resources
- Keeps equipment operational by completing preventive maintenance requirements, following manufacturer's instructions, troubleshooting malfunctions, calling for repairs
- Maintains safe and clean working environment by complying with procedures, rules and regulations
- Conserves resources by using equipment and supplies as needed to accomplish job.
- Contributes to team effort by accomplishing related results as needed
- Notify the Department Supervisor of any BOM discrepancies and provide suggestions for correction.
- Submit Engineering change requests when corrective action is know
- Adheres to all RVIA standards directed by Management.
- Reduces scrap levels
- Help improve customer satisfaction rating
- Keep lines moving to ensure daily goals and schedules are being met directed by Management
